## FOR ADMISSION OFFICERS: CLASS OF 2022

- Bellarmine students are not able to "double up" in core academic areas until the senior year as is possible at other schools. An essential part of our education in the Jesuit tradition lies in the religious courses required each year and in our requirement for Christian Service each year. We know that colleges and universities value the character our alumni bring to their campuses resulting from their Bellarmine education, discernment and reflection, and service.
- While students were not required to attend in-person classes on campus during the 2020-21 academic year, they were given the opportunity briefly in the Fall and more extensively in the Spring. Approximately 25% chose to attend classes in person in late Spring 2021. 106 of our 107 full time teachers taught on campus during the Spring semester.
- Letter grades (with weight for Honors and APs) were awarded in Spring 2020 and throughout the 2020-21 academic year.
- SAT and ACT assessments were virtually non-existent in the Bay Area from March 2020 through March 2021. Spaces for Summer and Fall SATs and ACTs were filled almost immediately when registration opened. As a result of lack of testing opportunities and the expansion of test-optional policies, we are reporting 2020 data for your reference.
- Every effort was made, given Santa Clara County health restrictions, to provide opportunities for athletics, the arts, robotics, speech and debate, clubs and organizations during the Spring 2021 semester, whether virtually or in person. Students were also required to undertake Christian Service activities.
- As of August 5th, all students were welcomed back to campus. Vaccinations are required for those participating in extra-curricular activities and masks are required on campus according to Santa Clara County health restrictions.
- Due to faculty staffing realities Biochemistry and Organic Chemistry are not offered this year.
- We offer a total of 19 Advanced Placement and 11 Honors courses. Our limitations on the number of honors/AP courses students may take remains in place and are scheduled based on placement and counseling: one course in the freshman year; three in the sophomore year and four in the junior and senior years only if they are also scheduled with free periods.

# ADMISSIONS CRITERIA AND PROCESS

**Eligibility** Applications are accepted from 8th grade boys enrolled at parochial, independent and public schools, as well as from qualified transfer applicants in 9th, 10th, 11th grade.

**Criteria** Applicants are evaluated on academic performance in junior high school course work, co-curricular involvement, academic recommendations, results on the High School Placement Test and other standardized tests, and on written essays.
